A story of sight – and confidence! – restored Warmest thanks to you from 'The Smiling Granny'!

This bright smile belongs to Namey, who lives in a small village in Arunachal, India. Namey is 91 years old and very popular with the children of her tribe, who affectionally call her "The Smiling Granny."

But Namey's face hasn't always been so happy. Over the past few years, her vision slowly became worse and worse, until finally, she became completely blind. She needed support from her family to walk, both inside and outside – and she was always worried about falling. She felt she was a burden to her extended family. Even for personal hygiene, she was dependent on others.

Like so many elderly people faced with extreme poverty and the limitations of blindness, The Smiling Granny became depressed and withdrawn. Her family and friends were concerned about the formerly-cheerful Namey. They advised her to visit the nearby hospital for medical treatment, but Namey was deeply afraid of medical

treatment. She was adamant that she would not see a doctor.

But fortunately, some community health workers from an Operation Eyesight hospital partner were conducting a door-to-door survey, searching for people suffering from eye diseases... and Namey was diagnosed with bilateral cataracts.

Still stubborn, Namey initially refused help; but the trained health worker counselled her and followed up with her numerous times. Thanks to encouragement from her family, Namey slowly gained confidence to seek help.

On the day of her operation, Namey was nervous. But the next day, when the bandages came off and she discovered her vision was restored, she was overjoyed!

Today, Namey's no longer dependent on others' help. And much to the village children's delight, The Smiling Granny is walking around the community by herself again, visiting friends and attending church, which she hadn't been able to do for a few years, due to blindness.

She's very grateful to generous donors like you for helping her regain her sight and her independence. Thank you!








2016 country highlights

India

- Partnered with 56 hospitals to implement Hospital-Based **Community Eye Health** projects across 17 states
- Declared another 130 villages as avoidable blindness-free
- Established 23 Vision Centres
- **Trained** over 2,000 eye health professionals
- Launched our first Community-Based **Rehabilitation Project**
- Implemented a Community-Based Diabetic **Retinopathy Program**
- Diagnosed more than 1,700 patients with eye tumors and performed 6,445 procedures at the **Operation Eyesight Universal Institute for Eye Cancer**
- Introduced **new technology** at 40 of our Vision Centres

Nepal

- Expanded our Hospital-Based **Community Eye Health Program** to the country
- Upgraded eye care facilities at our two partner hospitals
- Established two Vision Centres



Zambia

- Drilled 22 boreholes in the Sinazongwe district
- Trained 30 local villagers as pump minders
- Distributed antibiotics to 111.139 individuals through a door-to-door strategy



Kenya

- Examined 177,279 children through hospitals, community outreach programs and school screenings
- Established a **new eye unit** at Huruma Sub-County Hospital
- Continued to fight trachoma through implementation of the **SAFE strategy**: **S**urgery, Antibiotics, Facial cleanliness and Environmental improvement, including wells and latrines.

Because of your support, she received surgery to correct her inverted eyelashes and preserve her remaining sight. Today, she is pain-free and can continue caring for her children, thanks to you!

Ghana

- Completed the first-ever National Blindness and **Visual Impairment Study**
- Ran an eye health awareness campaign in partnership with Ghana Health Service
- Conducted training workshops for primary eye care workers and optometrists
- Equipped 18 partner hospitals with low vision diagnostic equipment




