New eye unit in Kenya is transforming lives

In September, we opened a new eye unit at Kerugoya County Referral Hospital in Kenya. The eye unit is part of a larger community eye health project being implemented in partnership with the Kirinyaga County government, through support from Standard Chartered Bank's Seeing is Believing program and donors like you.

This is the first project in Kenya that has fully embraced Operation **Evesight's Hospital-Based Community Eye Health Program model.** Working with the Ministry of Health, we will open two more eye units, provide training for ophthalmic workers and community health workers, and support our partners in providing quality eye care for everyone.

Our goal is to declare 150 villages in Kirinyaga County as avoidable blindness-free by March 2020.

Even better, this project will become self-sustaining, and our partners will continue to provide quality eye care for generations to come – thanks to YOU!

"I couldn't work or even tell people apart unless I recognized their voices, and my wife Pauline had to lead me around our home," says James, a 70-year-old farmer from Kenya.

James suffered from bilateral cataracts and desperately needed surgery. To get treatment, he'd need to save enough money to cover a trip to Nairobi, two hours away. But how could he save money if he couldn't see to work?

Then everything changed with the opening of our new unit at nearby Kerugoya County Referral Hospital James learned that he could receive cataract surgery there free of charge.

"I was not at any point afraid of surgery," he says. "In fact, I was among the first patients at the eye unit."

Thanks to the generosity of people like you, James received surgery on one eye. He can see again!

Today, James is working on his farm and eagerly awaiting his second surgery. In his spare time, he enjoys taking a moment to appreciate the world around him.



James is so happy now that his sight has been restored - and it's all because of donors like you!

"We are always in too much of a hurry to notice our surroundings," he says. "One thing being blind for three years taught me is to always take time to appreciate the beauty around me.






A tour with a **Community Eye Health Worker**

Have you ever wanted to see the difference you're making, as a supporter of Operation Eyesight? Aly Bandali, our President and CEO, just got back from visiting some of our countries of work, where he got to see our **Hospital-Based Community** Eye Health Program (HBCEHP) model in action. Through this model, we empower people living in the service area of our partner hospital to seek eye care, while improving the hospital's ability to deliver quality eye care services. On his journey, Aly saw the impact you're having, every single day. We want you to see the same things he has, **so we arranged a tour.**

Meet Harriet, a Community Health Worker (CHW) who lives and works in Ghana's Mfantseman Municipal District. Formerly a community nurse, she's been helping us deliver eye care services to families in need for the past 10 months. She's going to show you first hand the lives you're changing...





Harriet works out of Saltpond Government Hospital, which has been our partner since 2011. Harriet screens people in the surrounding communities and refers patients to the hospital for treatment.

When we implement our HBCEHP model in districts like Mfantseman, we divide the area into clusters, containing about 5,000 to 25,000 people. We recruit people like Harriet, preferably female and a part of the health community, to be CHWs, because they have experience and have already established trust within the community. The CHWs are trained according to our curriculum by our partner hospitals, in this case Saltpond Government Hospital.

Then CHWs visit everyone in the cluster. Yes, everyone. They go door to door to identify those with eye problems. When they find someone with eye health issues, they refer them to the appropriate level of care, such as a vision centre for eyeglasses or the hospital for surgery. The goal is to declare entire communities as free of avoidable blindness. That means nobody is suffering from blindness that can be cured or prevented.

Harriet's patients

Harriet has lots to do! She's trained in survey methodology, maternal and child health care, immunization, women's empowerment and more, so she serves as a resource for the community. That helps build trust, so she can make sure people get the care they need.

Today Harriet is following up with patients. She visits around 40 people a day, and she'll introduce you to three people whose sight has already been restored. Each of them will have the same thing to say: "Because of you, we can see. Thank you!"

At age 75 and suffering from cataract, **Kwabena** was able

to make his way to his farm with great difficulty, but unable



Joseph permanently lost his vision in his left eye after an injury four years ago. Then he developed cataract in his right eye, robbing him of his remaining sight. He lives alone, so there was nobody to look after his farm.

Harriet found Joseph during a door-to-door survey and took him to Saltpond Government Hospital for surgery. Now he can see, but the surgery wound isn't completely healed, so Harriet visits to apply the eye medicine he needs.

During the month of September, Aly Bandali, our President and CEO, travelled to Kenya, India and Nepal to see our work for himself. Here's what he had to say about the trip...

"While I was away, I had two overwhelming feelings: On the one hand, seeing the poverty the people were living in was deeply affecting. It was hard stepping into a world where my privilege was so obvious. Knowing I would wake up in a quality hotel in the morning and visit a poor community that day really put into perspective just how different my life is. The other side of that feeling was the pride I felt at seeing the impact we're having on the lives of the people in these communities. No matter where I went, the gratitude I was met with was overwhelming. I left each village feeling even more inspired to continue doing what we do, because the ripple effect of our work through our program model is enormous. Because when someone can see again, they can work and enjoy life.

"The hardship faced by someone suffering from avoidable blindness is terrible. Not only are they unable to provide for themselves or contribute to their families, many of them are subjected to complete social isolation. The beliefs around blindness in many of the communities we work in are superstitious. If someone goes blind, it's often seen as divine punishment for a wrong the person committed in their life. This is where our impact really shines – community health workers are transforming the communities they work in by dispelling these limiting beliefs. They educate communities to take ownership of their own eye health.

"Our staff and partners around the world are truly making a difference in the lives of others, and it's all thanks to the support of our generous donors!"


Halfway there: 2020 by 2020
